April 1939—Midwest AA separates from the Oxford Group.

April 1951—First AA General Service Conference, New York City.

April 1954—The Alcoholic Foundation becomes the General Service Board of AA.

April 1960—Bill W declines cover story for *Time*.

April 1961—Big Book sales reach 500,000 translated into three languages.

April 1973—Distribution of the Big Book reaches one million.

April 1979—*A.A.: An Inside View*, a film for public information, released.

April 1981—*Markings on the Journey*, an historic film for internal AA use, released.

# From the First Vice Chair— The AA Grapevine

From the SENY website (http://aaseny.org/):

The AA Grapevine, dubbed a "meeting in print" by members of the armed services, was first published in June 1944 as a bulletin with news of the fledgling Fellowship for members. By 1949, with distribution expanded to include Canadian AA members, the Grapevine had become AA's international journal. The history of the Grapevine reflects the history of the Fellowship. For instance, the "Serenity Prayer" and the "Twelve Traditions" (originally, "Twelve Suggested Points for AA Tradition") were introduced to AA through the Grapevine. Also, many of AA co-founder Bill W.'s writings beyond the three major books he authored through AAWS . . . were first published in the Grapevine.

The Grapevine is now published monthly. A forum for contemporary AA thought, it is professionally produced by AA members. Most articles, art work and other materials are also submitted by AA members. A bi-monthly Spanish language edition, *La Viña*, has been published since June 1996.

The AA Grapevine remains a vital place for AA's and AA's friends to share on our Three Recovery, Legacies, Unity and Grapevine's Digital Archive (an online collection of material dating back to 1944) offers a priceless, searchable collection of AA history and thought. The Grapevine also has a full catalogue of books. and other Grapevine-related items. But our "meeting in print" could use some subscription support. Next time you are thinking about an anniversary gift for a fellow member, forget about the coffee mug, coin or other non-AA item. Why not consider a gift subscription to the Grapevine? Subscription cards for both the Grapevine and La Viña are available at the Intergroup office or subscribe (including gift subscriptions) online at: http://www.aagrapevine.org/.
